# **Course Description**

### Understanding of International Relations

This is an introductory course on International Relations theories and methods. This course provides an overview of the activities, participants, and politics involved in International Relations at the state and local levels. By the end of the course, students should be conversant in basic IR theory and have the intellectual equipment to understand, criticize, and apply these (and other) theories of international relations. The course is also designed to provide students with an understanding of the potential and limitations of theory in the study of international politics.

#### Sailing Yacht

This course is designed to provide students with an understanding of basic concepts in sailing. Students who successfully complete this course should be able to achieve knowledge of different types of knots and boats, and parts of a yacht as well as the history and theory of sailing. This course consists of lectures(1<sup>st</sup> week) and practical training(2<sup>nd</sup>-3rd week).

#### Korean Culture with a Foreign Perspective

Korean Culture with a Foreign Perspective will be discussed based on Communicative Approach and designed to have international and exchange students who are interested in issues in Korean society gain more understanding about the issues by performing various communicative tasks. Furthermore, by comparing the issues in Korean society with theirs, students can experience a certain degree of universality and particularity in social issues.

# **Course Description**

# Sports SCUBA diving and Understanding the aquatic environment

This course is designed to provide students to learn the theory of skin diving and scuba diving and practical skills of sports diving. Students who successfully complete this course should be able to have the ability to understand and explore the aquatic environment and ecosystems of the ocean. This course consists of lectures(1<sup>st</sup> week) and practical training for basic swimming, skin diving, and scuba diving (2<sup>nd</sup> -3<sup>rd</sup> week).

### Sport Diving

This course is an introductory and beginner level of sports diving(skins cuba diving), and students will learn skin scuba theory and techniques to be come a underwater leisure activity specialist in the marine leisure sports industry. This course consists of lectures(1<sup>st</sup> week) and practical training (2<sup>nd</sup> -3<sup>rd</sup> week).
